Been outside lately? How much of your roof is visible? Dark colors reduce and hide imperfections, while light colors enhance and enlarge, drawing eyes up towards unique architectural details like dormers and gables.

**DO TRY BEFORE YOU BUY.**  
Bring shingle samples home to observe at different times of the day.

### TREND ALERT

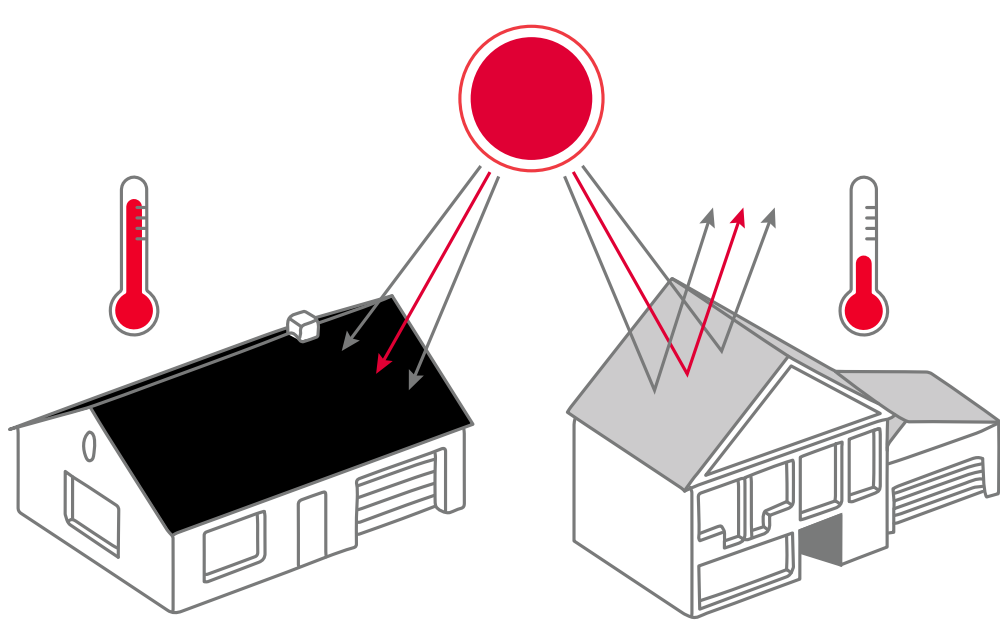
**WOOD SHAKES**  
Get this rustic look by selecting asphalt shingles with a high-definition profile in brown, dark green or blue.

## WHERE YOU LIVE

When choosing a shingle color to match your home, always look at actual samples in different light conditions and remember that natural light varies considerably by location, not just time of day.

### LOWER YOUR CARBON FOOTPRINT

Look for shingles with high-reflectance granules. Now available in a range of colors, from white and grey to darker shades of grey and brown.



### GOING LIGHT?

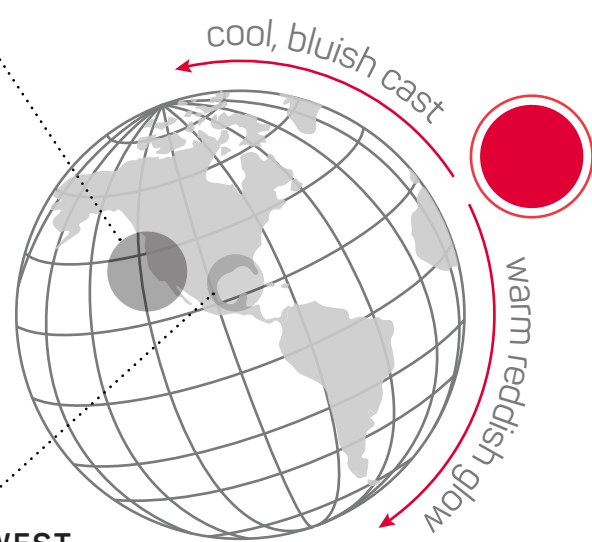
Look for shingles with algae-resistant granules to help reduce the appearance of harmless but unsightly black streaks.

### DID YOU KNOW

Light-colored shingles reflect heat and may keep your home cooler.

### PACIFIC NORTHWEST

Consider shades or combos of grey, brown or green to harmonize with the natural environment of sea and evergreens.



### DESERT SOUTHWEST

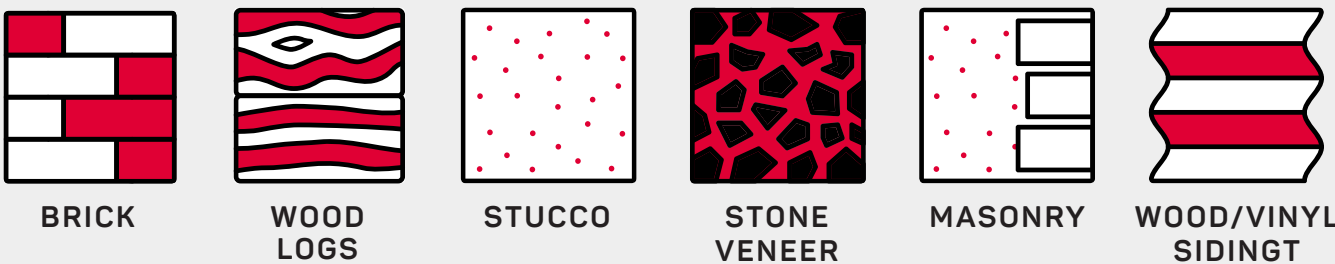
Cool colors may look washed out in the sunset glow of the desert or the tropical light of Florida.



State building codes now require cool roofs that are Title 24-compliant. Ask your local roofing contractor for details.

## MATERIALS

Let your home's exterior elements guide you in matching shingle colors. Construction and building materials can vary by geographic location.

Wood siding can be painted to improve coordination.

### DO'S & DON'TS

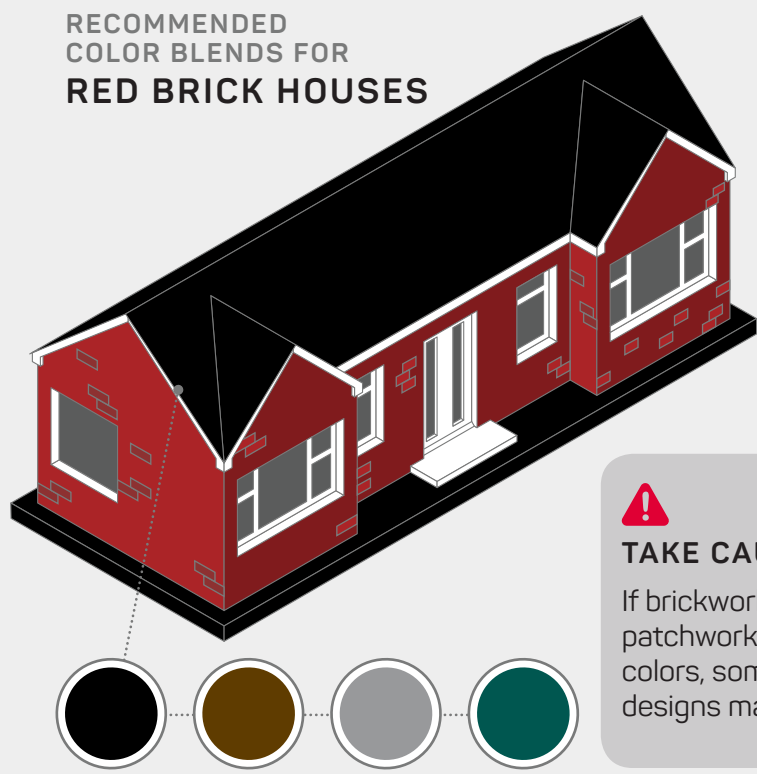
**DON'T CLASH WITH OTHER EXTERIOR ELEMENTS.**

### RECOMMENDED COLOR BLENDS FOR RED BRICK HOUSES

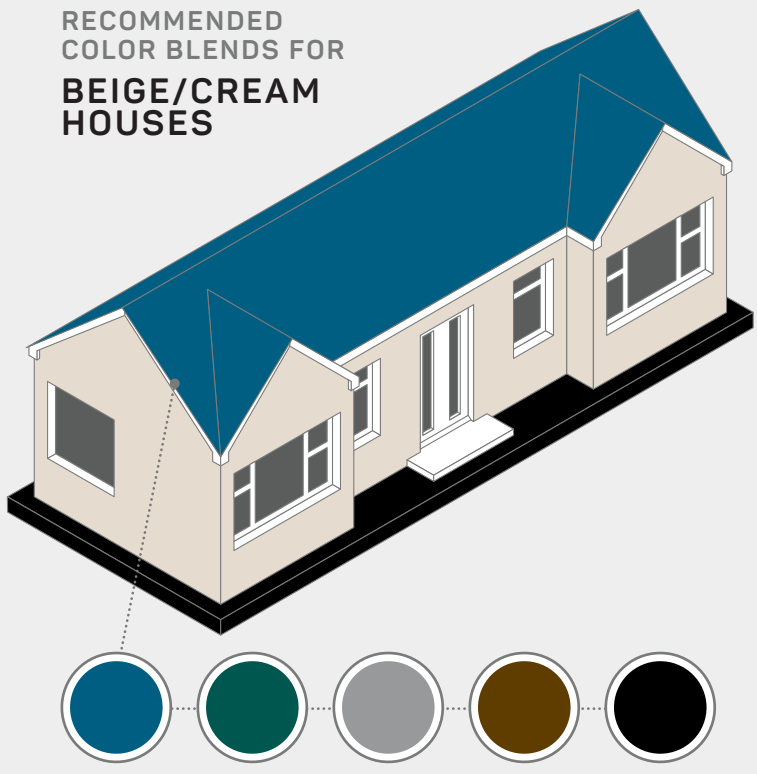


**TAKE CAUTION**  
If brickwork has a patchwork of multiple colors, some shingle designs may clash.

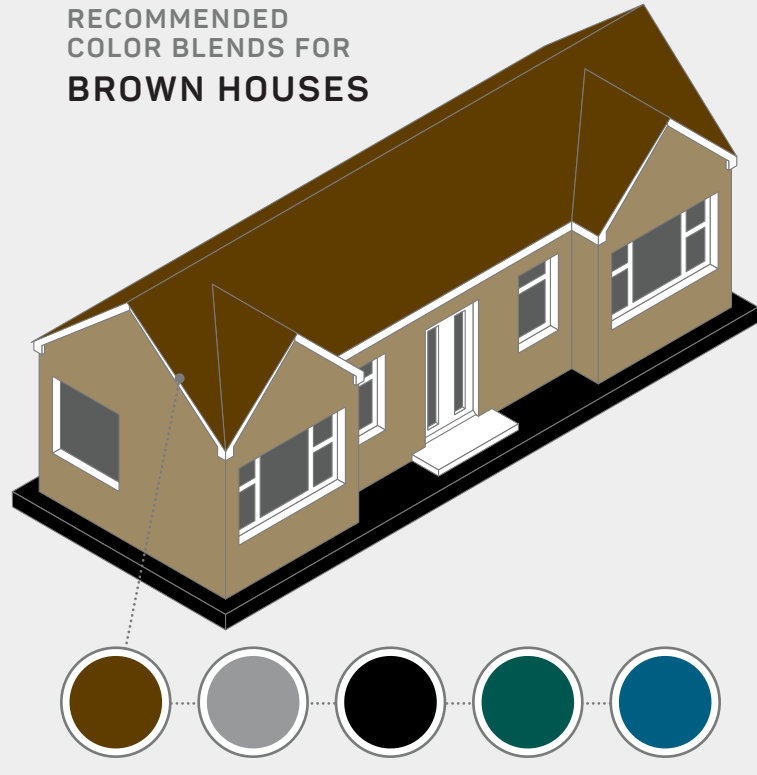
### RECOMMENDED COLOR BLENDS FOR GREY HOUSES



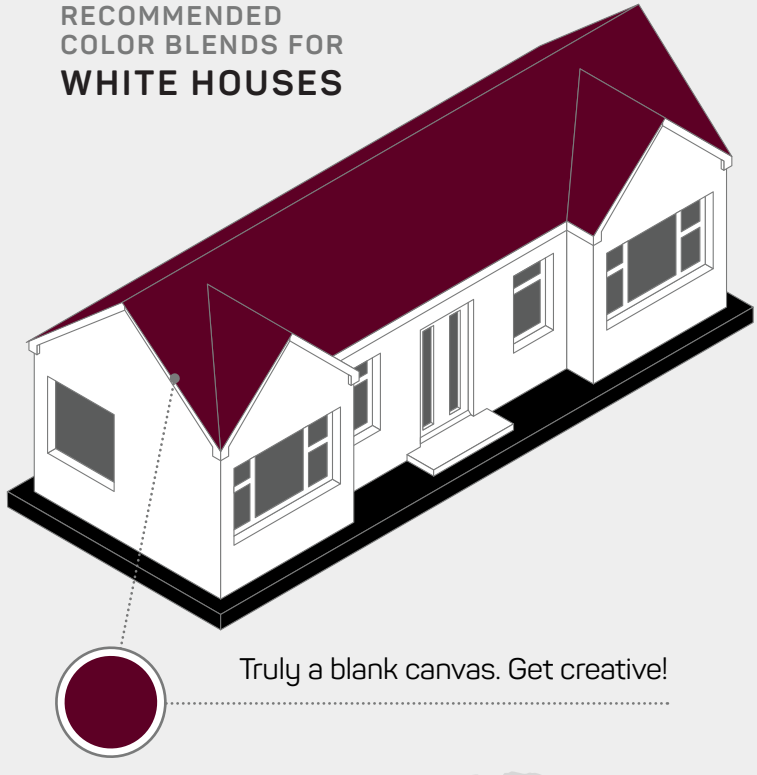
### RECOMMENDED COLOR BLENDS FOR BEIGE/CREAM HOUSES
